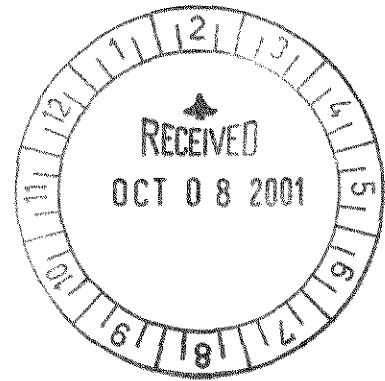

Enclosed are four woodstove lists for your information:

- 1) List of EPA Certified Phase II Wood Stoves
- 2) List of EPA Exempt from Certification Wood Stoves
- 3) List of Colorado Approved Pellet Stoves
- 4) List of Colorado Approved Masonry Heaters

Reminders:

* "EPA Exempt from Certification" stoves are simply those devices not meeting the EPA definition of a wood stove for various reasons (air/fuel ratio, weight, burn rate, etc.). They may be sold in Colorado but not operated on a high pollution day.

* EPA Phase II means the same as Colorado Phase III.

* For particular details concerning Wood Stove/Wood Burning rules, please consult *Colorado State Air Pollution Control Regulation No. 4* or call Gary W. Finiol at (303) 692-3165 with questions. Woodburning enforcement issues should be directed to local agencies specifically or to Hugh Davidson (303) 692-3157 of the Colorado APCD in areas under state jurisdiction.

* Note that some pellet stove models listed on the approved pellet stove list have also been subsequently approved as EPA Phase II wood stoves.
